Mrs. C Mozley and Mrs. B Kerr attended to express their concerns on the increased volume of traffic that has resulted from the construction site on Green Lane, and worry it is going to remain dangerous when the workshop is completed, with access of buses on to the site. Informed that Cllr. Smith is readily available to attend to any concerns. They also inquired about the possibility of pavements and footpaths along both New road and Green Lane. PC to investigate.

Mr D Hunt attended to inquire about the on-going speeding issues on New Road and on the High Street. Matter is being dealt with; PC is currently in touch with Community Speed Watch following up on the possibility of adopting the scheme on New Road. PC agreed that it would be a good purpose for Neighbourhood Watch since the police now use their Community Messaging Service to disseminate information instead of N.W.
